Modern Hero Of Faith



Mother Teresa was a Roman Catholic nun and missionary. In India, she taught at the Loreta school for 20 years before becoming headmistress. It was around this time that Teresa claimed to hear the calling of God, who told her to help the sick and needy. At the time, India was very poor. Teresa felt she must do everything possible to ease their suffering. Mother Teresa is mostly known for her charitable work, rather than her life as a missionary. In 1950, she established the Missionaries of Charity - an organisation that cared for people in extreme poverty. In India, lots of people were afraid of diseases like leprosy or AIDs. But, through this organisation, Mother Teresa cared for them. Mother Theresa kept working until she was 87.
